ST MARY'S CHEDZOY OPENS ITS WEST DOOR by Carole Edmunds

The opening of a door! It might not sound like headline news! The West Door at St Mary's was boarded up internally in the 1960s and has never been opened since. Until now!

The anticipated cost of the door renovation was well beyond the resources of Chedzoy PCC and although some aspects of the project will be grant funded this work could only go ahead with the support of the church's friends and neighbours who have donated over £1,000 to date.

With a grant secured from Historic England's Heritage at Risk Fund for nearly half of the £16,000 needed, the timber door can be saved by replacing an earlier repair with spliced in bespoke panels and the entrance brought back into use. The surrounding stonework and threshold, deteriorating rapidly due to weather damage, will also be refurbished. The work is being carried out on site so we are watching the progress. Preparation for the work involved removing the draft proofing – rolled up copies of the Daily Mirror dated January 1970! And installing a new entry point for the electricity, for which the builders needed the biggest available drill in Somerset to penetrate the four feet thick wall of the tower. The PCC are excited to see this project finally started as it will be another beautiful feature for the historic church.

Thanks to the extended warmth in September the Herbary has bedded down and established well. If there are any budding natural dyers in the village, go ahead and pick some of the Dyers Camomile flowers and have a go.

The bus stop garden is now complete and should be bursting with life in the spring, we used sheep's wool to suppress the weeds and also installed a second water butt to harvest the rain and make it easier to maintain.

The 15 metre Permaculture Bed is in, what's Permaculture? Basically it's permanent agriculture using perennial or self seeding plants. What have we got! A massive mint bed to keep the cocktails topped. Welsh, walking and chive onion, horseradish, selfheal, teasel, ragged robin, tansy, sorrel, curry, verbena, salvia, pelargonium, clary sage, lovage, sweet woodruff, mullein, hyssop, fennel, rhubarb and achillea. Thank you to the amazing volunteers that pitched up to help.

Who are Freewheelers.

A registered charity since 1990 operating an out of hours (overnight & weekends) emergency medical courier service. The area covers Somerset, Bristol and Bath hospitals, hospices and homes delivering: - Blood Pathology samples X-rays & scans Patient notes Drugs Equipment Breast Milk We also provide a nightly service 7 nights a week to two air ambulance bases As Freewheelers, we are all volunteers who not only deliver the service but have to raise the money to enable the service to operate at no cost to the NHS.
