

At the end of the service Malcolm Friend paid tribute to him, thanked him for 14 years work in our parish and presented a John Lewis voucher to him on behalf of the PCC and congregation. Chris was also given a number of individual gifts including this stunning watercolour of the Church, painted by Tom Jacobs from Combwich. Chris and Lorraine have moved to Norfolk to be close to their family, including grandchildren, so he will be kept very busy.

CAROLE EDMUNDS



Let's Climb Yr Wyddfa by John Paige

Part 2 - Kill the Pyg, kill the Pyg!

We have arrived in the Pen-y-pass car park at the base of Snowdon (sort-of), it's blowing a gale, rain and hail showers are constantly blowing through, the temperature's around 8°C, and we're heading through the car park, moving to the right to hit the start of the Pyg Track to the summit of Mount Snowdon (Yr Wyddfa), Wales's highest mountain. In the past, I've been described as 'all-the-gear-n-no-idea' but today we'll need the gear; conditions are harsh, the rocks are slippery (and hard!), and I've not renewed my life insurance; let's go!

The well-maintained path goes straight into a steep ascent heading towards an overhanging spur, then veers to the left and after about half an hour, we break out onto a ledge that falls away almost vertically. Ahead we can see many of the big peaks of the Snowdonia mountains; breathtaking and beautiful. Beneath us lie the 2 big lakes on the inside curve of the Snowdon Horseshoe, Llyn Llydaw and the smaller Glaslyn (we'll be walking around them on the way back down on the Miners' Track); above and to our right is the formidable ridge (or arête) of Crib Goch (Red Ridge) but we'll have to take that route another day; conditions are too dangerous today. Between the hail and rain showers, there are brief periods of sunshine so give yourself a moment to take in that view; it's 'proper awe-inspiring' and we're feeling truly alive: harsh conditions, incredible scenery, a steep ascent, we're in Snowdonia's most beautiful region, we've only just started out and already we can see the Pub from here – knockout!

Following the ledge around, we scramble up what can only be described as a small waterfall (ouch, that water's cold) to the top of a 50 m craggy peak, where the majority of the challenge that lies ahead is laid out before us. The track ahead winds ever upwards, over numerous crags, from col to ridge and ridge to peak then it turns right and steepens dramatically, up what looks like a glacial corrie, to the ridge just shy of the summit. Swallow hard and push on!

In this Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, I have often seen as many as 3 Peregrine Falcons soaring the ridge of the horseshoe on the lookout for prey, and Ring Ouzels on the rocks around the lakes, but not today. I've even heard of sightings of Choughs, but I've never seen one in Snowdonia.

Onwards to where the other significant track up Snowdon, known as Miners', comes up in a steep ascent from our left (we're going back down that way) and joins the Pyg, so forward to the big ascent. Time for a break first. There is a row of those rock-filled wire cages (known as Gabion Baskets – who on earth carried them up here?) placed strategically to hold back falling rock debris – perfect for rain-bathing! If I were organized, I have a flask of something hot, but water and chocolate will have to do; then onwards.

The last push is not difficult, but it is steep and requires stamina, and I feel as fit as a butcher's sloth; these legs are going to hurt tomorrow but an hour or so later, over the top

onto the final path up to the summit: holy cow – the conditions are appalling: wind that is almost impossible to stand up in and rain that stings every exposed inch.

Walking the ridge that follows the railway track to the top is nasty, but we've got this far so onwards to the steps that take us up to the brass-capped cairn, which marks the actual summit, then straight back down to get out of this weather. Down the ridge and drop over, back onto the path the other side, which is sheltered from the ferocious wind. Phew, that was brutal.

Playing Field Update by Kerry Evert

As part of the Chedzoy Fair Share Scheme, we have been very busy adding new and exciting elements to the Playing Field. These include some lovely trees next to the bicycle track, under which we have placed a new bench which was kindly donated by the Chedzoy Pre-school, with a plaque to commemorate the place many of our children attended their preschool years! We chose a bench made of recycled plastic, which is maintenance free and will provide a space for parents to sit while their children enjoy the bike track.

We also planted 18 trees which will eventually grow into a beautiful woodland area and we hope to plant some bulbs under the trees as they grow. This area is next to the Willow Classroom, which is starting to show signs of life as we move into warmer weather!

We have also placed matting on the inside of the track, this is to stunt the grass growing in the centre of the track and we will be planting some perennial flowers in the middle of the track which will not only help our pollinators, but also limit the amount of difficult mowing!

We will be planting the remaining 400 trees from the Queen's Jubilee Green Canopy Fund grant. These trees will be used to create a sustainable hedge along the back of the field (furthest from the gate). That boundary currently has a fence which is not in brilliant condition and we don't have the funds to replace it, so besides the great environmental impact, it is also creating a sustainable solution to the fencing which would otherwise have become a problem in not too many years' time.

From what I understand, the ploughing match people have already suggested that it would be a wonderful place for their hedge laying competition in a few years' time, so that is a positive development too!

Garage Sale

The Chedzoy Brocante and Garage Sale is back! Always a busy event, and after a 3-year hiatus we are hoping it will be even bigger and better this year. For a small donation the church tower will be open for visitors too, if you've never climbed the tower before it's well worth a visit, the views are spectacular!

Having spent much of the past 2 years at home or in lockdown, many of us have managed to have a clear-out (or 2!), but if you haven't there is still plenty of time. Scheduled for Sunday 22nd May from 10am-4pm, all you need to do is register (see email address below) and sell your items from your driveway. Pitches are also available at the village hall, a lot of footfall and near the refreshments too!

The £5 per seller fee goes to 3 worthy causes within the village. For this reason, we ask that if you share your driveway or your table with another seller who doesn't live at your property, the cost is £5 per seller ie 2 sellers on one driveway = £10 total, 3 sellers = £15 total. Fees will be collected during the week before the sale. For those not familiar with the layout of the village, we will provide maps at various locations on the day.

We are also lucky enough to have a stall at the Old Rectory by Trish of Vintage in the Avenue, Bridgwater, a lovely vintage clothing shop, so if you fancy something unique and special, look no further....

Snippets from the Minutes

Below are a few snippets from the latest Parish Council meetings. Full minutes can be found at www.chedzoyparishcouncil.gov.uk. Just a straw poll. How many of you have actually visited this site? It has a wealth of local information. Local footpaths, Fairshare Scheme, etc.

Jubilee Beacon – It was agreed to buy a Gas Beacon (£490 plus VAT) for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations. Afterwards it was to be sited in the Bus Shelter Garden together with a Commemorative Plaque

Parchey Footpath — This has recently been re-opened so that access is available from Parchey to the fields heading towards Westonzoyland

Speed Indication Device (SID) – This is due to be erected once the strong winds have subsided, making it safe for personnel to erect it.

Local Government Elections – Correspondence encouraging eligible voters to make sure they are registered in time for the May elections

Fair Share Scheme — There is now a link on the Parish Council website for nature walks relating to the Fairshare scheme. The Parish Council felt this scheme is something to be proud of.

Why not be a Parish Councillor?

Whilst talking Local Government, are you Community minded? Do you think that Chedzoy gets its fair share of funding? What should our Parish Precept be spent on? What should the Parish Council be doing to help the Villagers aspirations? Have you a pride in your surroundings? Meetings are usually once every month and last for about hour and a half.

We need to do something about improving our buses in Somerset. Our county currently has the second lowest level of bus journeys per resident of all the counties in England and Somerset's bus services have the very lowest level of passenger satisfaction in the country.

Residents of Somerset experience this every day, whether it's with difficulties getting to health services, reduced opportunities for those seeking work and further education or just the limited (if any) evening and Sunday bus services. As a result, we see ever increasing numbers of cars on our roads which causes higher levels of local air pollution and increase our carbon emissions.

Somerset Bus Partnership was formed just a year ago to campaign for better bus services across our county and already we have a Somerset-wide network of 115 town and parish transport representatives who share our passion for better buses.
