Our beautiful and historic Chedzoy church is open every day, officially from 10.00 am until 5 pm but usually longer so you are free to visit at any time. Maintaining the building and churchyard continues to be a challenge. The vast majority of the costs must be met locally through giving and fundraising, and by grant applications. The current focus for fundraising is the repair needed to the church roof in several places. Simple Hot Cross Bun Recipe

By Will Clothier

I made these first when in lockdown and have enjoyed making them since. I'm currently doing cooking as my skill for Duke of Edinburgh Bronze, which means cooking something every week for at least 3 months.

Ingredients

500g strong, white bread flour

50g caster sugar

50g butter (cubed)

200g dried mixed fruit

7g dried yeast

200ml milk

2 eggs

2 heaped tsp mixed spice ½ tsp

salt

To decorate

3 tbsp plain flour

2 tbsp water Honey or golden syrup



Equipment

Oven

2 mixing bowls

Measuring jug

Fork or whisk for beating

Blunt knife

Baking sheet

Cling film

Piping bag

Pastry brush

Method

- 1. Mix the bread flour, salt, mixed spice and sugar.
- 2. Rub in the butter using your fingertips and stir in the dried fruit.
- 3. Sprinkle the yeast over the mix and stir.
- 4. Carefully, warm the milk and beat this with the eggs. Then, add the dry ingredients.
- 5. Mix the ingredients until they form a moist dough and leave for 5 minutes.
- 6. Remove the dough from the bowl and cut it into 8 equal pieces.
- 7. Shape each piece into a bun and place on a floured surface. Then, put them on a baking sheet. Cover them loosely with cling film and leave in a warm place until they have grown about 50% bigger (anywhere between 45 minutes and $1 \frac{1}{2}$ hours).
- 8. When they have risen, mix the flour with the water until it forms a paste. This will make the cross decoration on top.
- 9. Put the paste into a piping bag. Pipe crosses on top of each bun.
- 10. Bake for 12–15 minutes until golden. Brush the honey or golden syrup over the top.
- 11. Enjoy warm or toasted with butter!

(Makes 8-12 depending on how big you like them)


Villagers to run London Marathon for NSPCC by Mary & Mat Clothier

Chedzoy's Great Tommy Camp Out '23 by Paul Haynes

Every March the RBLI (Royal British Legion Industries) organizes a Great Tommy Camp Out to raise funds for the many homeless Veterans in the UK. During the Camp Out, fundraisers can choose the level of "homelessness" they wish from makeshift cardboard shelters to fancy tents – the accommodation doesn't matter as long as the money comes in for this much needed cause.

As a member of The RBLI's Tommy Club I receive regular newsletters, which was how I came to hear of the campaign and with veteran support being very close to my heart I immediately signed myself and William up for this year's campaign. A couple of conversations later over a beer or 2 at a Pop-In night I was soon to be joined by a burgeoning cohort from the village plus Martin Chandler had very kindly pledged £1000 support from the Pop-In charity fund. A few WhatsApp messages later the date was set for March 11th with our final group consisting of Mark & Jack Holder, Kyle, Jonathan Dethier along with Will and I.

As the date drew closer, keen eyes on the forecast suggested that a quick recce was in order to decide a suitable location with some strong winds predicted. Ray & Simon Triggol had kindly offered us use of their fields behind the village and following a quick scope of the fields we settled on a location behind the farm where some barns would afford us some sort of shelter from incoming weather.



With Land Rovers suitably positioned to support the barn as a wind break our temporary "shanty town" was built and with some straw bales (kindly donated by John House) to stop wind from blowing under the vehicles, we were set. Sandra had very kindly provided a delicious stew for our evening meal and we had a couple of firepits providing some warmth as it drizzled and rained into the night.



As the afternoon progressed Marion, Rea and Sid plus Philippa and Poppy called by, then, just before dark, we had a visit from our host Ray to check we were safe \bigcirc , as night fell, getting suitably "embalmed" in a mix of liquids we variously sang and joked through the rather soggy night.

A wholesome breakfast of bacon and egg rolls with strong tea rejuvenated us in the morning before breaking camp - this to me was the point that reality struck home, with us all having the luxury of returning to our loved ones in warm and safe homes - so unlike those we had set out to support!

Anyway, the upshot of all of this means we, along with a number of others, have raised lots of money to support these veterans in need. As I type, the running total for the 2023 Campaign is £86,351 of which our pot sits at £2,760 which is amazing!

On behalf of "Chedzoy Hobos", I would like to thank all of you who contributed either directly or via the funds from the Chedzoy Pop-In donation as well as the Triggol family for the use of the field and John House for the loan of his straw bales.

Items discussed at recent Parish Council meetings included

New Parish Councillor

Due to the resignation of Brian Gale on ill health grounds (since then Brian has died. Our condolences to his family), Mr Graham Bentley expressed an interest in joining the Parish Council. After advertising on the local notice boards, no other applicants were forthcoming, and Graham was co-opted.

Parchey Footpath

The Parish Council are still trying to get the footpath at Parchey re-instated to dry land as it was never redirected when the King Sedgemoor Drain was widened. New definitive maps are being produced and it is important that this is rectified before they are produced.

Speed Watch Team

There were enough volunteers to form a Speed Watch Team under the guidance of the Police.

Budget Overspend 2022/23

This was now at a projected overspend of £24.3 million. Cutbacks were due to be made in CCTV provision and library services.

Volunteer Drivers for Medical Appointments

There is a desperate need for volunteer drivers to get patients to medical appointments. Since COVID over 30% of drivers have not returned.

Village Design Statement

Councillors are trying to produce a Village Design Statement and have come forward with some ideas but would welcome any suggestions/ comments from residents.
