Rector's Ramblings September 2024

Well, I have a lot to ramble about this time. It has been such a busy summer. The highlight was the Benefice Fete at the end of August. I am so grateful to everyone from both churches who joined together to make it such a success. We made around £1400 which has been divided between the two churches. But it is not about the money for me. For me, the most important thing is bringing people together to work together for a common cause and to have a lot of fun at the same time. Chedzoy Village certainly came up trumps with so many people offering their time and their money to contribute. We have a surprising number of committees in the village – church, village hall, parish council (to name a few) who all strive to make this village a good place to live. I got to know members of some of them better during the planning of the fete and have a better understanding of Chedzoy village life as a result. The church committee struggles to find new members and I am very grateful to the village hall ladies (you know who you are) who have kindly offered to take over the organising of the Harvest Supper. This is the best gift ever and I can't thank you enough both personally and on behalf of the PCC.

Talking of harvest and on a personal note – my husband was diagnosed with vascular dementia this time last year and it is increasingly difficult for me to be away from home in the evenings. I therefore will be unable to attend the harvest events but will be thinking of you. Harvest is such a difficult time for so many people in our rural communities and at Harvest Festival we give thanks to God for his blessings on our farms and fields and all they contain. When the harvest is poor it is so difficult to look forward with any sort of hope. But now as I drive from place to place the fields have been ploughed and have turned a beautiful brown. Soon the green shoots of new life will be visible and that in itself is a sign of hope. A hope that what we have planted will flourish and that next year we will have a bumper harvest. The Church is all about following the mission and ministry of Jesus. Jesus' greatest gift was to love people so that they grew and flourished in their lives. As mere humans, all we can do is to sow the seeds and to nurture them as best we can, but it is God who makes things grow – crops and humans alike. St Paul tells us:

"I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labour of each. For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building." (1 Corinthians 3: 6-9)

The common purpose that St Paul speaks of was manifest in the way we worked together this summer both in God's field and in his building. So, thank you again. I close with God's blessing: Deep peace of the running wave to you, deep peace of the flowing air to you, deep peace of the quiet earth to you, deep peace of the shining stars to you, deep peace of the Son of peace to you. Amen.

Matters discussed at recent Parish Council meetings include

Trying to get a Flood Plan together. The Environment Agency were to be asked to attend a meeting with villagers relating to flooding problems. The Parish Council intend to do a survey of where all the drains are in the Parish. This will enable them to target flood prone areas.

Speedwatch was still on hold due to the lack of action from the highways department to bring the signage and roundels up to Police acceptable standards.

The Clerk was asked to register Chedzoy’s interest in the VE Day 80 celebrations planned for 8th May 2025.

STAY SAFE FLOOD ADVICE

Before a flood

- Sign up for flood alerts and weather warnings
- Prepare your personal flood plan
- Locate water stopcocks and electrical master switches
- Take detailed photos of house and contents now
- Prepare a flood 'grab bag'
- Prepare a flood store cupboard
- Check your personal flood equipment each year
- Identify where you'll move your car to
- Remain calm

Flooding imminent or current

- Put your personal flood plan into action
- Tune into local radio
- Don't put yourself at risk by entering flood water
 - Ankle deep fast-flowing water can knock over an adult
 - Water that's knee deep can move a car
- Wash your hands thoroughly if you touch floodwater it may be contaminated
- Call 999 if you are in danger, or people have been injured
- Check on vulnerable neighbours
- Remain calm
